His research has focused on Edo-period art, and in recent years particularly on erotic art (*shunga*). His many publications include: *Gendaigo-yaku: Shunga* (2010); *Nichibunken shozō kinsei enpon shiryō shūsei* (5 vols.; co-editor, 2004–10); *Nihon no zuzō: Shunga* (co-author, 2010); *Shunga no mikata: Jū no pointo* (2008); *Shunga: Himetaru warai no sekai* (co-editor, 2003); *The Shunga of Suzuki Harunobu: Mitate-e and Sexuality in Edo* (2001); *Ukiyo-e shunga o yomu*, 2 vols. (co-author, 2000); *Shunga no naka no kodomotachi* (2000); *Ukiyo-e shunga to nanshoku* (1998).
